
Felix Gillet

The Father of California and Pacific NW Perennial Agriculture

- Established his Barren Hill Nursery in Nevada City, CA in 1871, the second major nursery in California
- Imported and bred hundreds of plant varieties that became the foundation of West Coast agriculture, and particularly California perennial crops. Many of his introductions are still commonly grown, while others provided the foundation breeding material for todays commercial and home varieties.
- Ran nursery until his death in 1908, then carried on by C.E. Parsons until 1967, when it was the oldest operating nursery in California
- Primary source for the commercial establishment in the West: Almonds, Walnuts, Chestnuts, Filberts, Prunes, European Plums, Wine, Table and Raisin Grapes, Strawberries, Pears, Cherries, Figs, Apricots, Peaches, Quince, Apples, Roses, Currants, Gooseberries and numerous other crops


A CHAPTER ON WALNUTS.

Proparturiens or Fertile or Early- | which gave him twenty-three full-deshed, Bearing Walnut .- Since the introduction by us into California, in the winter of 1870-71, of this valuable kind of walnut, we have found it to do still better in this country than in its native land, France. In the latter country the nut grows from small to medium, though very rich; but in California from medium to large. With seedlings, entirely raised here, the nut takes all sorts of shapes, though more commonly a somewhat oval shape, and quite broad at the head, with a full-fleahed, sweet, delicate kernel.


We have upon our place, as showed to visitors, Proparturiens walnuts of two, three and four years in bearing; but will say that the Prosparturiens does not go to "regular bearing," that is, do not grow any staminate buds, or catkins, before any other kinds of walnut, except grafted trees. Such young Proparturiens that bear pistillate blossoms or nuts, with a complete absence of staminate or male blossoms, must have the nuts fertilized by the catkins of larger walnuts in the neighborhood, should they be at a distance of half a mile. The pollen of the Black walnut's blossoms, if carried by the wind in the direction of the little Prosparturisns loaded with nuts, will fecundate the latter without mixing up the kinds. The pollen from a catkin may also be shaken upon the little trees' blossoms, and thus be made to fertilize their nuts, as Mr. Ed. Muller, of Nevada City, did, in the year 1884,

very pretty nuts. People must, therefore, well understand that, as precoclous as the Proparturiens is in bearing, still it does not go to "regular bearing" before it is seven to eight years old, unless planted in very rich soil where it will make a very large growth the first five


or six years. But this precocity in bearing and its great fertility, is not, by far, the most important characteristic of the Prosparturiens walnut; for we have invariably found that its pistillate buds are fully out at the same time as its staminate buds, which is an immense advantage on the common English walnut, whose staminate blossoms are out and gone before the pistillate ones or nuts have appeared; so that when the latter are out, there is not a solitary catkin on the tree to fertilize the nuts. At least such is the case with the English walnut in Nevada, Placer, Alameda, and other counties in California, and also in Oregon, as we were told lately. In Nevada City and neighborhood, we have twenty-five years old English walnuts, that are yet completely barren, frost or no frost, though full of blossoms every year. So we would call the special attention of the horticultural public to this anomaly and defect of the common kind of English walnut as cultivated on this coast; and it is easy for anybody to ascertain the correctness of those facts at blooming time, wherever there with a little tree obtained from us, and are such sorts of unbearing, barren walnuts.
